

District Council Reports

President - Tyler Hern

Dear Spicy Southwest,

I was beyond humbled by the opportunity to serve as your District President again this past year. After I was elected for my second term at the last District Convention, I immediately set out to work. For the rest of that Spring I continued making monthly updates for the chapters of the Southwest as well as working with chapters to get our final reports of the year submitted. We knew that this year would be a challenge because a lot of chapters were just now going back to in person operations and with most of our chapters having a lot of new members, it was a challenge to say the least. After we finished the year strong we set our sights on the National Convention.

I had the honor of sitting for the Southwest District during the 2021 National Convention and being the chair for the Jurisdiction and Finance Committee. It was the first in person event in so long. I was so happy to get to be with all of my sisters and brothers in person to rejoice in the organization that we love so much. It was a whirlwind of emotions that proved to be one of the best experiences. After this, it was time to focus on the school year coming up.

Our next event for the district was the chapter leadership conference to kick off the school year. Our joint councils hosted this event right before the start of school to make sure our chapters had everything that they needed for the upcoming school year. During the fall, I communicated resources made for the Chapter Personnel Report and the Fall Activities Report, made monthly updates for the chapters, had monthly Tau Talks for the Presidents, and started planning District Convention with my amazing counterpart. I also started planning for our District Winter Council over the break. One of our main goals for the district this year was to have 100% of our chapters obtain the red stripe for Focus on Five. While we did not achieve this goal, a lot more chapters completed this stripe this year which is a win in my book.

Then came our Winter Council meeting with the joint district councils for convention planning. This is traditional in person at the convention site. However, due to COVID, which has to be the catchphrase of anyone's life these days; it was moved virtual and only a few of us were actually able to come and see the site. The 2022 Jurisdiction & Finance Committee was charged with the following:

- 1. Redistribute funds to reflect a non-national convention year.
- Review 9.04.1 to determine if the budget could sustain two scholarships during a National Convention year.
- 3. Review the number of applications for the district scholarship and reallocate funds for the next two scholarships as necessary.

- 4. Review the number of applications coming in for the travel assistance funds and reallocate funds as necessary.
- 5. Evaluate \$250 from 2020 increase to Convention Assistance and Delegate Registration to see if increase remains appropriate for next year.
- Review Kappa Kappa Psi's 2021 Southwest District Constitution and check for inconsistencies that don't require a joint discussion.

Finances:

The Jurisdiction and Finance Committee reviewed the budget from last year (a NatCon year) to come up with a proposed budget for the 2022-2023 year.

The committee was charged with allocating a \$2,000 surplus into other budget areas. We discussed allocating \$300 for a service project/relief donation to the Andrews High School Band program after the loss of their head band director. \$200 was initially added to the Scholarships budget, leaving us with a \$1,500 surplus. The committee then discussed adding a budget line using this \$1,500 surplus to fund a SWD TBS Composition Competition project. Since the current year was a non-NatCon year, and Area workshops are leaning towards future virtual options, the committee made the decision to propose a lowering of each District Officer Travel Expenses budget from \$500 to \$300 each. This change gave the committee an \$800 surplus, \$500 of which was allocated back to the SWD TBS Composition Competition project. \$150 of the remaining \$300 was then added to the Scholarships budget line at \$75/scholarship. The remaining \$150 surplus was added to the Miscellaneous budget line. We allocated \$200 of the 2020 \$250 budget increase to the Convention Assistance and Delegate Registration budget line to total \$1,000 to cover an average of 5 Convention Assistance applications up to \$200 per

chapter. The remaining \$50 was allocated at \$25/scholarship to the Scholarships budget line, bringing the total to \$600/scholarship.

These proposed budget changes will be reviewed momentarily.

- Discuss the chapters in attendance at the 2022 Southwest District Convention on the qualities of spirit and sisterhood. Award the Spirit and Sisterhood Awards in accordance with the District constitution.

Discussion during meetings/relevant information

- Sisterhood database
 - a. The committee found that Sisters did not know the sisterhood database existed.
 - b. The committee found that the best way to inform chapters of resources is through Instagram (resources highlights reel), a Slack channel for resources, sending links and/or instructions on finding resources through chapter email, and adding resources to the newsletters.
 - c. The committee also found that chapters could be more entitled to check chapter emails with a reward/award for responding to X amount of emails, subject

indicators of importance, sponsor involvement, and additional members within the chapter with access to the emails.

- Review of Southwest District videos for District and National Chants
 - 1. The committee found reason for new videos to be made and uploaded to the Southwest District website due to the following:
 - a. The second Southwest chant video did not have clear dictation and explanations. The committee also found that sisters could have shown more spirit and/or enthusiasm in their demonstration.
 - b. The National chant video was not clear, not well explained, and not in the correct order corresponding with our music guideline. The committee would like to suggest ending on the first variation to make the ending of the chant more distinct.
 - 2. The committee agreed that there should be lyric sheets/sheet music attached with the video to ensure proper accessibility to sisters/brothers with hearing impairments and to help sisters/brothers learn the proper lyrics.
 - 3. The committee decided that in order to replace the unclear videos, a contest between chapters should be put in place to have new videos created. Chapters will submit videos of all three chants and will compete to get their videos posted on the Southwest District website. Chapters will receive a spirit-stick like award. Videos will be due at or before next convention and will be chosen by the spirit and sisterhood committee.
 - 4. The committee would like to propose a verse added into the National chant, as a variation that we created specially for the Southwest District.
 - a. The verse will go as follows:
