Chicken with Alfredo Pasta Recipe

I have gone through many fondue recipes with cheese (and chocolate!). I might post the best fondue recipe next year, but this recipe came with the aftermath of the fondue. One would know that besides cheese, the next most important ingredient in fondue is the white wine! However, since fondue only calls for a bit of wine, there is always a lot of leftovers, and since no one in my family drinks, the wine would go bad, and we would have to throw it out. This gave me an idea... what if we cooked something with the wine? This is how I found my favorite chicken recipe. At the same time, I was trying to find a good alfredo sauce recipe because I am not a fan of the pre-made jar ones. I found these recipes, and although I only make it after fondue, I am always tempted to make it! Note: I did not produce these recipes, (only some adjustments) I merely want to share these! The alfredo sauce is from The Salty Marshmallow and the chicken is from Salt & Lavender.

These two recipes are reasonably quick and easy. I always make it simultaneously, especially when the chicken is cooking. Also, it is best to cook the chicken in a cast-iron skillet, but if you do not have one, a large pan will do. What is great about these two

recipes is that they use the perfect amount of ingredients together. For example, for both recipes, you only need to buy 1 pint (16 ounces) of heavy whipping cream to use, and you will use it all up without worrying about what you're going to make with a random amount of ingredients.

I hope you enjoy! MLITB

TOTAL TIME: 30 mins, 4 Servings

INGREDIENTS

- 2 large chicken breasts cut in half lengthwise
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- Flour for dredging
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 3 tablespoons butter divided • 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1/3 cup chicken broth
- 1 pinch Herbs de Provence (or Italian seasoning)
- 1/2 cup heavy/whipping cream

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Cut your chicken breasts in half lengthwise to make 4 thinner cutlets. Sprinkle them with salt and pepper and garlic powder, then dredge them in flour so they're nicely coated.
- 2. Add the olive oil and 1 tablespoon of the butter to a skillet over medium-high heat. Once the pan is hot, add the chicken and cook for 4-5 minutes/side until golden. Take the chicken out of the pan and set aside (chicken shouldn't be fully cooked yet).
- 3. Add the wine and chicken broth to the pan and let it bubble for about a minute. Stir to scrape up any bits from the bottom of the pan
- 4. Add the remaining butter and the Herbs de Provence to the pan and continue simmering for another 2 minutes
- 5. Add the cream and chicken back into the pan. Reduce the heat to medium and cook for another 5 minutes or until the chicken is cooked through and the sauce has thickened up a bit. Season with extra salt & pepper if needed.

This sauce is easy enough to make at the same time when the chicken is cooking. I love to use this recipe with farfalle pasta (mainly because I love "Bowtie" pasta), but feel free to use your



Alfredo Sauce

Total Time: 10 minutes Servings: 2 Cup

Ingredients

- 16 oz Farfalle Pasta, or any kind
- ½ Cup Butter
- 1 ½ Cups Heavy Whipping Cream
- 2 Teaspoons Garlic Minced
- ½ Teaspoon Italian Seasoning
- ½ Teaspoon Salt
- ¼ Teaspoon Pepper
- 2 Cups Freshly Grated Parmesan Cheese

Instructions

- 1. Boil a salted pot of water for the pasta and cook it al dente according to package
- 2. When the pasta is approx, 10 minutes away from being done, add the butter and cream to a large skillet over low heat
- 3. Simmer over low heat for 2 minutes
- 4. Whisk in the garlic, Italian seasoning, salt, and pepper for one minute
- 5. Whisk in the parmesan cheese until melted, you can save some for topping
- 6. Serve immediately.

This sauce is easy enough to make at the same time when the chicken is cooking. I love to use this recipe with farfalle pasta (mainly because I love "Bowtie" pasta), but feel free to use your favorite kind of pasta. Also, if you do not have a food blender, do not want small chunks of garlic in the sauce, or to have a full head of garlic left over, fill free to use garlic powder instead. It is best to use freshly grated parmesan cheese, so that your sauce isn't grainy. I usually use either BelGioioso Freshly Grated Parmesan Cups or Frigo Shredded Parmesan Cheese Cup. The Parmesan will thicken this sauce up. If it isn't quite thick enough, allow the sauce to stand for 2-3 minutes before serving.
