

Appendix A: Final Officer Report - Secretary/Treasurer - Mason Thomas

Brothers of the Southwest District,

Appendix B: Final Officer Report - Vice President for Programs - Edgar Canales

Brothers of the Southwest District of Kappa Kappa Psi,

Thank you. It has been an absolute honor to have served as your Vice President for Programs. I will always feel humbled by your faith in my ability to serve and your vote to elect me through acclimation a mere 10 miles from my home chapter. This is an honor very few will ever get to experience and I am still deeply honored I was one of those people.

Not everybody gets a term on this council, much less two. I can not express how each interaction with you, my Brothers, means to me. Whether we met for the first time online, in Grand Rapids, Springdale, here, or in *Natchitoches* (na·kuh·tuhsh) deep frying everything from Cheeto Puffs to spam, I want you to know that these experiences have changed my perspective on what it means to be a Brother.

I still remember running for Member-at-Large. Southwest District Convention: Zoom Edition was the first true convention I attended in Northwest Arkansas. I felt a calling to serve and submitted my election material. This turned out to be one of the best decisions I made. I gained an opportunity to not only serve but learn from some of the best leaders in our organization. I remember realizing at National Convention in 2021 that I belonged here and I wanted to serve this organization as long as I could after spending time with TJ Coleman and learning so much about our District while we waited for a 2 A.M. Doordash order to arrive.

I knew this year would be different. I had a year of experience under my belt and knew what to expect. I was no longer afraid of the Governors! Going into this year, I knew I had work to do.

My charges going into my term were as follows:

- Re-Evaluate the operations of the New ALTO. Befriend your staff, have staff
 picked by October, and start early to receive the most quality submissions.
- Evaluate all awards (individual and chapter) and start promoting them early to affirm those chapters with great achievements.
- Reach out individually to chapters about their award eligibility even if this means picking up the phone and calling every chapter president.
- Start planning the joint service project early, giving everyone enough time to be able to prepare to partake in the project.
- Create a platform, such as a Facebook group or Google Classroom, for chapter VPS/VPPs to find resources and to meet other chapters' VPS/VPPs.
- Do not be afraid to ask for help, there will be many times you do not know what is going on. Ask questions and push through.

I came into this position with a great vision for the New ALTO. I am so excited to present it soon as we celebrate 35 years of the publication and 10 years of it in a digital medium. While I wish I could have done a better job at reaching out, we received many quality submissions. I would like to recognize the New ALTO team for their work on the publication: Jalien Edwards-Design Editor from the Zeta Mu chapter of Tau Beta Sigma, Cyrus Jackson - General Editor from the Alpha Psi chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi, Victoria Hernandez - General Editor from the Psi Chapter of Tau Beta Sigma, Noah Boggs Riley - Copy Editor from the Lambda Chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi, and Mackenzie Murphy - Copy Editor from the Beta Nu chapter of Tau Beta Sigma.

Award applications need to be reworked. It should not be difficult to honor our successful and high-achieving chapters. After working with the Awards Application, I recognize that we need to revamp the application process to ensure each chapter has the opportunity to showcase areas where they excel.

Reaching out to chapters individually changed me so much for me. Contacting chapter presidents across the Southwest District was worth it. I was anxious going into it, yet, the first time a person pick up on the other side felt so natural. I remember feeling such a strong yet random sense of Brotherhood as I reached out to a stranger that I had so much in common with. This is something I am so glad I decided to go through with.

The Joint Service project has been such a success this year! We are so close to breaking \$200 - you can help us achieve this by clicking on the link in our bio! Profits go directly to a local high school to help provide supplies to their band program. I am proud of the improvement in how we went about organizing this fundraiser.

I was able to meet with a few service officers, but I know that we can do better. This has been an area of growth the past few years and I wish I had more than a charge to leave behind.

Brothers of The Southwest District,

This year the 2023 Southwest District Chapter Leadership Committee was charged with the following:

- Review the report of the 2022 Chapter Leadership Committee
- Review all applications for the D.O Wiley Award to ensure all applicants are eligible for consideration
- Develop a series of questions for each applying chapter and establish criteria to determine the most deserving winner
- Organize a schedule for applicant chapter presentations
- Review the applying chapters and their presentations to deliberate the 2023 D.O. Wiley Recipient
- Recommend any changes to the D. O. Wiley Selection Process to the Jurisdiction Committee
- Have the chapters only turn in one electronic copy of the application instead of paper copies at the time of convention

This year the Chapter Leadership Committee met three times before District Convention to produce a list of questions to ask all eligible chapters applying and to establish criteria for awarding the D.O. Wiley Award. Since the committee would be meeting virtually prior to District Convention, we discussed as a committee whether or not PowerPoint presentations would be acceptable and, given the different format, we determined that this would be acceptable. Our committee feels like these questions we produced this year could ease the stress of creating questions for next years' committee:

1. Which of the pillars does your chapter exemplify, and which of the pillars do you think you could exemplify better?

- 2. How does your chapter deal with challenges? These can include chapter burnout, the impacts of COVID, or anything that the chapter has had to overcome this year.
- 3. How does your chapter work with other musical organizations on your campus?
- 4. Where has your chapter experienced the most growth, and how does that impact your plans for the future?
- 5. What does "brotherhood" mean to you, and how have you enhanced the experience of being a brother of Kappa Kappa Psi?

We have included below a link to a Google Document full of other potential questions that next year's committee could utilize.

Unfortunately, there were no applicants for the D.O. Wiley Award. As a result, in addition to providing these question for next year's committee, we wanted to use this year to reimagine the awards process to help Brothers where they are and lift them up to be able to recognize their Chapter's achievements.

The committee had no objections to the current process for applying for the D.O. Wiley Award, though there was discussion around making sure that, in the future, the deadline for awards applications was publicized further in advance so that Chapters would be able to better plan out their applications. Lastly, there may be room for further resources for Chapters on how to successfully complete their application.

Previous membership duties that have to do with reviewing Membership Calendars and being a student point of contact for expansion activities are now handled at the National level.

District Policy Guide, Section 3.2

- Change all instances of the title of "Vice President for Membership" to "Vice President for Leadership Development."
 - Rationale: The title "Vice President for Leadership Development" better describes the current nature of the role, with the main duties of the officer position having to do with Chapter Leadership Conference and Area Workshops. Previous membership duties that have to do with reviewing Membership Calendars and being a student point of contact for expansion activities are now handled at the National level.
- Strike the second sentence that reads "The Vice President for Membership serves as the student point of contact on the District Council for expansion activities and membership issues."
 - Rationale: This is no longer a responsibility of the position following changes to Fraternity expansion practices and the creation of the Curriculum Committee at the 2017 National Convention.

District Policy Guide, Sections 3.2 and 3.3

- Move the final sentence that reads, "In the absence of the President, the Vice President for Programs shall represent the District to the National Vice President for Student Affairs" to Section 3.2 and replace "Vice President for Programs" with "Vice President for Leadership Development."
 - Rationale: This change better reflects the line of succession as well as the responsibilities of the Vice President for Membership/Leadership Development already laid out in the District Constitution and Policy Guide.

District Policy Guide, Section 8.1

- Change all instances of the title of "Vice President for Membership" to "Vice President for Leadership Development."
 - Rationale: The title "Vice President for Leadership Development" better describes the current nature of the role, with the main duties of the officer position having to do with Chapter Leadership Conference and Area Workshops.
