Platform

Preparation

One of the President's main duties is planning district convention. I will use my skills in time management and multitasking to ensure that the requisite planning for district convention is done in a quick, efficient, and thorough manner.

- I would like to bring in speakers to lead workshops that focus on chapter recruitment and retention as brothers graduate. Through several conversations with chapters in the district, I have discovered that numbers, engagement, and communication are the main issues that we currently face in this post-COVID era.
- I will work closely with our district governors and my TBS counterpart to promote the district convention, and reach out to chapters to find new ways we can get more brothers into the convention and participate. I would like to promote what speakers and events will be at each district convention, and so that more people will be inclined to attend.
- Through my focus on communication, outreach, and culture, I will bolster the numbers of attendees at district convention. The more chapters are contacted and engaged with the district council, the more they will attend the convention.
- Through better engagement, we can assist chapters in manners related to awards and involvement on a national level, and help get our district members involved on a national scale.
- For chapters who do not struggle with numbers or retention, I would like to propose
 workshops that teach better music practices, ways to support other chapters in their
 surrounding areas, and help chapters learn how to better serve their local college and
 university band programs.

Communication

My time in this fraternity and in my other outside roles has shown me the necessity to have open channels of communication between all members of an organization. Better communication will yield an elevated standard, encouraging all members to strive for the highest.

- I wish to cultivate a high standard of communication between all parties in this fraternity, including the district council and chapters. I will work closely with our Vice President for Leadership Development, Member at Large, and Vice President of Programs to assist them in their roles and foster greater communication
- I wish to personally travel to other chapters in need and visit with them, and gleam a better understanding of their needs and wants. Within reason, I would also like to encourage the rest of the district council members to do the same.
- I would like to incorporate a livestream "fireside chat" style with the members of the district council. (Note: This would not share a name of the "fire psi-de chat" that the

alumni association does, and I would like to discuss a name for this with my fellow council members.) This initiative would allow chapters to tune in and ask questions, or simply visit and get to know their district council members better. I would like this to happen once a month, and promoted via social media pages, so chapters may have time to prepare questions or topics to present. The chat will be moderated by council members to ensure topics are treated in an equal and respectful manner, and so that the chat can stay focused, yet relaxed.

Outreach

In our Post-COVID age, there is a struggle in getting brothers and chapters to events. My goal is to counteract this struggle, and increase participation in in-person events, encouraging all chapters to attend. Many chapters also struggle with meeting other chapters and attending their events, and I wish to amend this as well. Overall, I would like to foster a deeper and more open connections between chapters and the district council. Here is how I plan to foster this,

- I want to spearhead a movement wherein chapters go to other chapters and meet with them, with the district council providing recognition for the chapters that attend other chapter's events.
- As has been done in the past, I wish to split the district up amongst the other district council members, and give each member a "sub-district" to maintain and communicate with. Sub-districts will be based on the location of the university affiliation. This will spread the workload amongst the entire district council, and allow chapters to get to know their district council not simply as a face or a name, but as a real person, thus better allowing council members to encourage and assist chapters in their local endeavors.
- On a monthly period, district council members will have contacted every chapter in their subdistrict AT LEAST once, and the district council will then report their findings at the next district council meeting. After district convention, the district council will open a contact channel with the chapters within their subdistrict. This process of regular reporting will put less strain on the council as a whole, while also increasing overall accountability for their work. This process will allow the previous system of splitting the district up to have more accountability.

Culture

The Southwest District is an amazing place made up of an amazing group of people that reside within its chapters. However, we are all guilty of getting so caught up in our work and the business side of the fraternity we sometimes forget why we do what we do. Here's where and how I think we can improve this,

• I want to encourage my fellow council members to have fun. I do not want our positions to become laborious or a drag. The more we enjoy this position of service, the better we will perform, and the closer we will grow as a brotherhood. I plan to lead this ideal by

- example. I wholeheartedly enjoy working alongside my fellow brothers to accomplish their goals and have fun doing so. While it is important to get a job done it is also imperative to enjoy doing it.
- I will include at least one event per council meeting, purely for fun, and will place this event in the middle of the meeting, between large projects. This will allow council members to decompress, relax, and then resume work with a refreshed mind and be better able to accomplish the task at hand
- I will continue to support an atmosphere and culture of musicianship. The Southwest District is reflective of many music styles, so let's use this to our advantage. If each chapter during their meetings, had a moment where they performed a small piece or excerpt of music for their fellow brothers, they would benefit and grow as musicians. We are in a music fraternity after all, so let's make music together.
- I would encourage chapters to share their musical achievements, and use the district council as a means to promote these successes.
- I will continue to cultivate a culture of service. I firmly believe we are in an age where bands are growing in taste, size, and talent. As a fraternity dedicated to supporting and promoting the college and university bands, we should capitalize on this, and use this period of growth to also grow our organization. This will help serve the fraternity and the band programs by promoting the band, and growing numbers in both factors.

I write to you today about Chance Harmon, the vice president of the Zeta Beta chapter as well as the vice president of the Howard Payne University Band.

Chance Harmon became an official member of Howard Payne University and Zeta Beta in 2022 and had changed not only the program but also fixed and created relations with his sister chapter and other chapters in the southwest district.

As a sophomore brother Harmon was placed in the position of vice president for the university band which means that he had the responsibility of preparing our biggest event in the fall semester which is Recruitment Night. This event takes about three weeks or more to prepare as well as working with our newest members of the band. Brother Harmon worked many nights with the newest members to prepare them for this big event. The night involves a one-hour skit performed by the freshman, setting up the stations that the freshman will visit (i.e. station of love,music,memory, etc.) organizing a hide and seek in the town (with safety restrictions), finding who will prepare the dinner, bring alumni to share their stories of how it was to be in the band and communicate with the sister chapter on making the bandanas for our newest members. He did this event and got everything done on his own and it was one of the most successful ones we've had in years. During this event brother Harmon was still taking more than eighteen hours, practicing almost every day, and still doing his responsibilities to serve the band while taking care of his mental health.

Communication is one of brother Harmon's greatest qualities. Delta Upsilon and Zeta Beta had experienced a lull in communication, Brother Harmon had amended this by communicating with the sisters on a daily basis, when there was conflict, he made the effort to have a sit-down talk with all the sisters and brothers to talk it out like adults. He has never made us feel like we are less than them and instead are equals.

The members of the Tau Beta Sigma Delta Upsilon describe Chance Harmon this way. Vivian Owinyo, our newest member who has worked with him during recruitment night and in her membership process, has stated "He's really good at communicating important events and ideas with others. He is a busy person but still makes time to fully plan out events showing his dedication and hard work in band." Zena Hargrove the vice president of Delta Upsilon states "he answers in a timely manner, he's a good multitasker and good at explaining/elaborating events on what he is saying/point of making."
